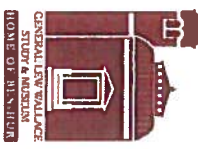

# TREES OF THE GENERAL LEW WALLACE STUDY & MUSEUM



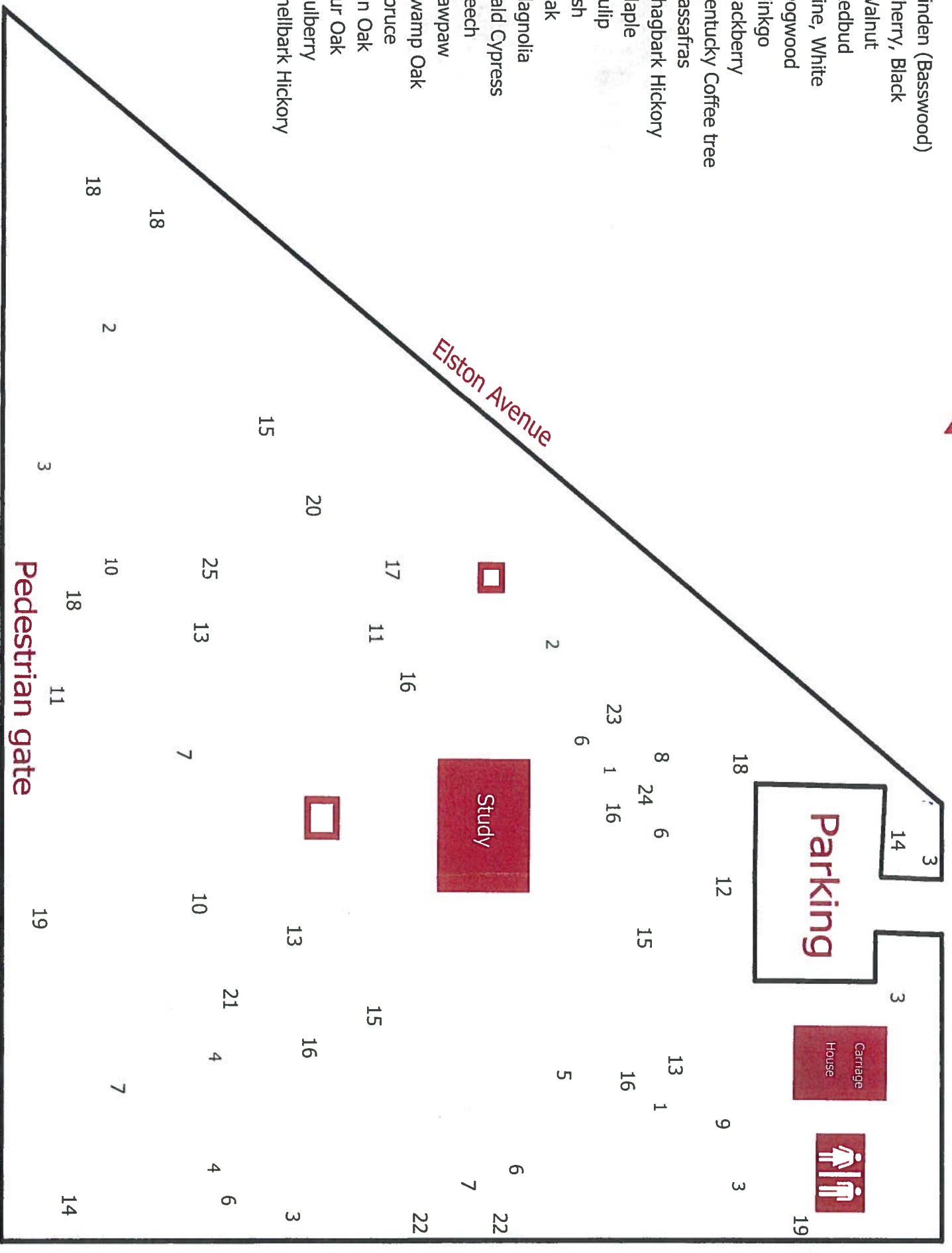
